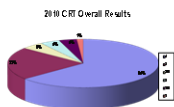

School Rules

Attendance:

Regular attendance is important to success in school and is required by law. When you miss school, you miss out! When a student is absent for any reason a parent must call the school at (435) 652-4742. Please call as soon as possible. A parent may excuse a tardy when an emergency situation results in a student arriving at school late. A student may not be excused for tardiness between classes. Six tardies equals a U in citizenship grade.

Character Ed:

Our theme this year for Character Education is “We Are One”. This is a program that our school counselors will be introducing and establishing throughout the school year. Its focus is to accentuate the positive and minimize the negative behaviors. Students will be given a card that is red (represents bullying) on one side and green (peace) on the other. They will have the right to indicate to their peers how specific comments and or actions make them feel without saying anything

Cafeteria:

Breakfast and Lunch are served daily with a variety of items to choose from. Breakfast is \$.80 per meal and lunch is \$2.25 per meal, unless a student qualifies for free or reduced lunch. Menus for the month can be picked up at the office. Students are not allowed to charge lunch unless there is an emergency. Money for meals can be paid to the lunch secretary in the mornings before school. We also have a student store that allows students to purchase snacks at lunchtime only.

Chewing Gum:

Gum is not allowed in school. Gum chewing violations may be reflected in a student’s citizenship.

Dress Code:

If students are in violation of the dress code we will allow them to call a parent to bring them appropriate clothing. If they refuse the student will go home. See Student Planner pages 20-21 for details.

Electronic Devices:

We discourage bringing devices such as: cell phones, iPods, mp3 players, cameras, etc. to school. Should they come to school and be confiscated they will be held in the office until the student’s parent/guardian comes to pick them up. If lost or stolen at school we will not be responsible.

Homework:

Homework can be requested if a student is absent for 3 or more days consecutively. If the work is requested a parent/guardian should pick up the work in the office after school.

It’s Gecko Time!:

This is a school-wide program to provide more time for student learning. It focuses on Intervention time and Enrichment time. For students who have not demonstrated competency on core concepts will be given INTERVENTION TIME. Students who have demonstrated competency will be given ENRICHMENT TIME and CHALLENGE TIME. The purpose of Gecko Time is to increase student learning, teach accountability, increase motivation for both students and teachers, and connect concepts taught in the classroom with their community and world.

Open House/Back to School: We invite all students and parents to attend our Open House/Back to School on August 10th (Tuesday) from 9:00 a.m. – 3:00 p.m. Plan to pick up 7th grade schedules, meet teachers, and tour your school. For sale will be: PE clothing, Organization Binder etc. (**Avoid Long Lines** by prepaying through the mail with check or credit card and picking up these prepaid items on this day)

PTA & Community Council: We have a very strong supportive PTA and Community Council here at LRIS. We encourage parents to become members of PTA. The cost is \$5 per membership. Please join...we need parent support. You can send membership dues in with student registration.

Personal Messages: Personal Messages will NOT be given to students during class time unless it is an emergency. Students may receive messages between classes or after school. Please plan ahead.

Powerschool: Powerschool is a student information system where you can check grades and attendance; each student will have their own individual username and password. Please check your child’s grades and attendance often.

Safe Routes to School: We encourage all of our walking and biking students to use sidewalks or provided walking paths. If you are coming from Santa Clara we encourage our students to travel on the bike path that goes around the parking lot of Gubler Park. Please do not cut across the parking lot. They will then walk across the new bridge onto school property.

Safe School Policy: Each Student is expected to follow accepted rules of conduct. Each student is expected to show respect to other people and obey persons in authority at the school. The policy applies to students while in the classroom, on school grounds in school vehicles and in school-related activities and events. See Student Planner page 11 for Safe School policies.

School Bus: Eligible bus students will receive bus passes at the beginning of the school year. Students will not be allowed on any other bus other than the one they are assigned to. If a student loses their bus pass they can be replaced at the office for \$5.00. If a student fails to obey school bus rules they may lose riding privileges.

Student Planner: Every student will receive a planner at the beginning of the year. Please check it often for upcoming homework assignments or school events. If lost you may replace it at the office for \$5.00.

Student Organization Binder: This year students will be expected to have a student organizational binder that they will use while attending Lava Ridge. These binders can be purchased from the school at our Open House/Back to School day on August 10th. The binders will sell for \$10 and include: 2 inch three ring notebook, notebook paper, 8 heavy duty plastic pocket dividers, and sheet protectors. These will help to keep students organized and successful.
